Community Funeral Services

1. Based on the wishes of our elderly community members, our management committee have negotiated funeral arrangements for the families of any deceased members in our community with Jamia Ghosia Mosque, 98 Chester Street, Blackburn BB1 1DW. This is only a temporary arrangement for our members until our funeral sub-committee comes up with potential plans that align with our members wishes.

In the event of a demise in the family, all our members can have full use of the mosque facilities including:

- Ghosl facilities
- Separate prayer hall for men and women
- Imam services can be provided by the mosque on request.
- These services come at no cost to the families but they are welcome to donate a minimum amount of £200 as a charitable donation to the mosque should they wish to do so.
- Any arrangements for food to be served in the mosque will need to be undertaken by the family themselves.

The management committee can also support our members with catering arrangements.

2. We are also funding the preparation of kafan (shroud covering the deceased) and ghosl mayyit accessories packs aligned to our Islamic values to be made available to our member families in the event of a demise in their family.
3. We will be producing a register/database of all our Cutchi marhoom (upon whom mercy has been bestowed) who have passed away and are buried in Pleasington Cemetery in Blackburn.

This register will include the name, burial site number and the location on a map. This will enable us to assist with future maintenance of the graves, inform our future generations where their elders are buried so they can pay their respects and recite prayers for the marhoom and ensure that they are not forgotten.

4. Our management committee team are also volunteering to clean up the graves of any of our marhoom members who are buried in Blackburn Pleasington cemetery. This will be carried out on behalf of any elderly/disabled members, families living or working out of town, or who have no next of kin left in Blackburn and/or those who cannot physically do this for themselves. Please contact us with the details of the gravesite via email or WhatsApp and we will organise this on your behalf.

Ghosl Training

We are in the process of organising workshops on how to carry out ghosl for our deceased. The workshops will take place in Masjid-e-Raza, Randal Street, Blackburn, by an experienced Imam. This training is aimed at both our male and female members. Any members interested in participating can contact us.

Voluntary Activity

The management committee are also looking for volunteers to set up 2 sub-committees.

One of the sub-committees will lead on supporting our members with funeral arrangements and explore how CMA can support our members with the rising costs of funerals.

The 2nd sub-committee will be responsible for organising and co-ordinating catering arrangements for events at our community hall.

Any members who are interested in volunteering to set up these sub-committees can contact us.

In Islam volunteering for funeral services is highly encouraged and considered a meritorious act. Specifically assisting with the washing (ghosl), shrouding (kafan) and burial (janaza) of a deceased Muslim is seen as a communal obligation (fard kifaya) and a source of great reward.
